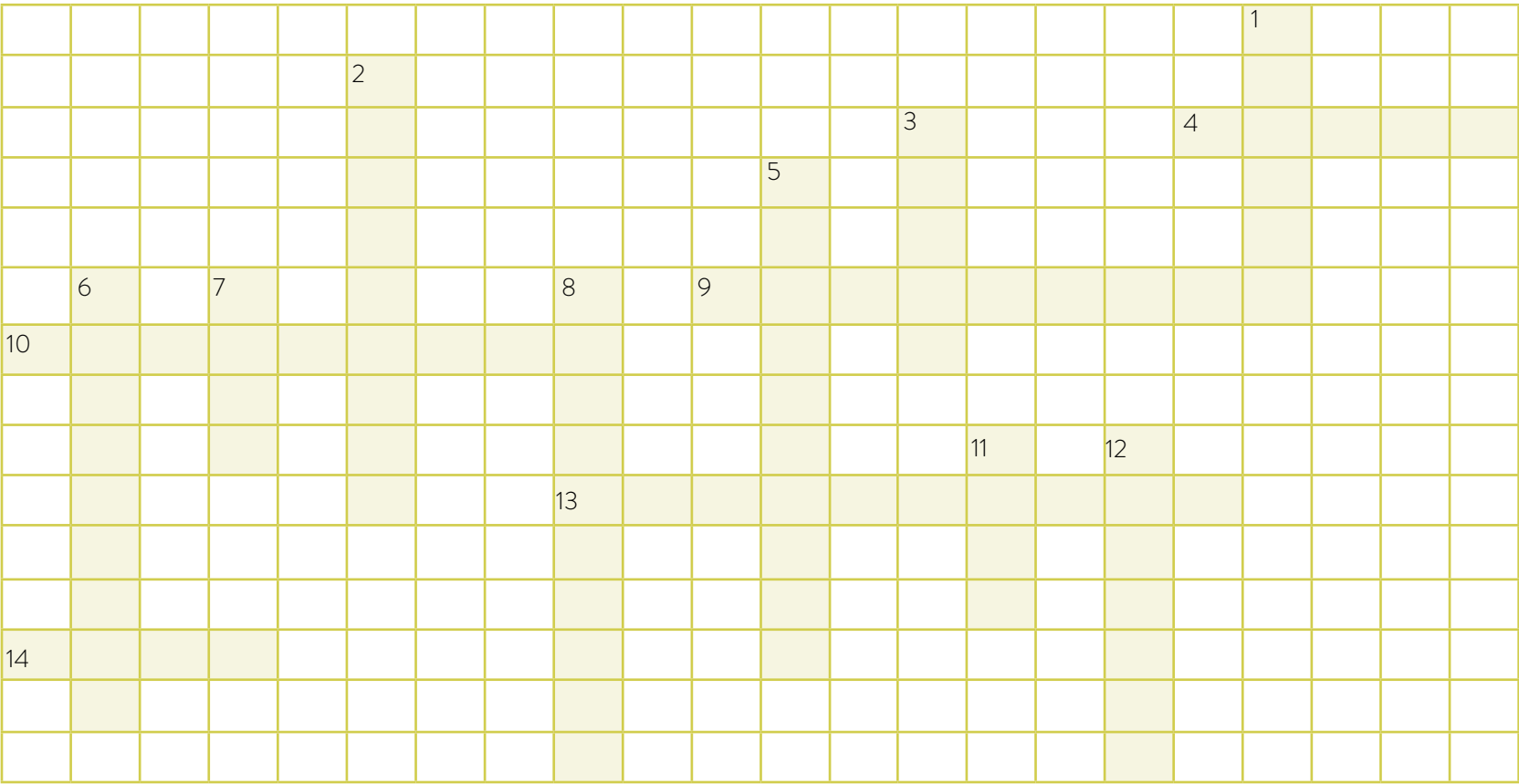
- 1. A small round red or black fruit. It's very sweet.
