

Vocabulary spot



The term *paratext* refers to the different statements that accompany the main text of a work such as the title, subtitle, preface, pictures, footnotes, table of contents, etc. These added elements form a framework for the main text and can help the reader understand the main text of the work.

Part A: Analyze the paratext of the article and answer these questions.

Buckingham Palace tour

Visit the official London residence of the Queen during the Buckingham Palace summer opening. Explore the extravagant State Rooms and don't miss this year's special exhibition, celebrating the 70th birthday of the Prince of Wales. In 2018, Buckingham Palace is open to visitors from 21 July until 30 September.



SEA LIFE London

Get a taste of the deep blue sea at SEA LIFE London. Spot up to 400 species including sharks, stingrays, moray eels and clown fish at the aquarium. See stunning green sea turtles and test your nerve on the glass "shark walk". Learn more at daily talks and feeding times.



Tower of London

Take a tour with one of the Yeoman Warders around the Tower of London, one of the world's most famous buildings. Discover its 900-year history as a royal palace, prison and place of execution, arsenal, jewel house and zoo! Gaze up at the White Tower, tiptoe through a medieval king's bedchamber and marvel at the Crown Jewels.





Madame Tussauds London

At Madame Tussauds, you'll come face-to-face with some of the world's most famous faces. From Shakespeare to Lady Gaga you'll meet influential figures from showbiz, sport, politics and even royalty. Strike a pose with Usain Bolt, get close to One Direction or receive a once-in-a-lifetime audience with the Queen.



Kensington Palace

Kensington Palace offers a glimpse into the lives of its past royal residents. Discover stories from Queen Victoria's life in the Victoria Revealed exhibition; master courtly games in the King's State Apartments; glimpse a modern princess in an exhibition of Diana's dresses; and uncover the secrets of a fragile dynasty in the Queen's State Apartments.

Grammar spot



In English, when we want to talk about future plans we use the structure **be going to**. For example: *I **am going to** visit Kensington Palace next weekend. My friends **are going to** take a tour around the Tower of London on Friday.* On this website [Woodward English](#), there are some interesting explanations about the grammar rules for this structure. Read the rules and then do the following exercises: [Oxford University Press](#) and [English Grammar Online](#).

Grammar spot



The sentences in exercise **d.** are in *Present Continuous*. We use this tense to describe what a person is doing or to talk about activities at the moment of speaking. On this website [British Council](#) there are some interesting explanations about the grammar rules for the Present Continuous tense. Read the rules (*Level Beginner*) and then do the exercises *Present Continuous 1 +* and *Present Continuous 2 +* published on this section.

Pronunciation spot

The **-ing form** of the verbs always adds an extra syllable to the words and this syllable is unstressed. For example: [read /ri:d/ - reading /'ri:dɪŋ/], [walk /wɔ:k/ - walking /'wɔ:kɪŋ/], [eat /i:t/ - eating /'i:tɪŋ/]. On this website [English Language Club](#) you can practise the pronunciation of the “ng sound” /ŋ/. While you watch the video, repeat the words that the speaker mentions. Then, follow these steps to practise the pronunciation of these verbs: *reading, eating, walking, sailing, taking, swimming, sunbathing, watching, writing and talking.*

1. Look up the verbs in any of these dictionaries: [Cambridge Dictionary](#), [Oxford Dictionary](#) or [Collins](#).
2. Click on the pronunciation button and repeat the words.
3. Record yourself reading the verbs and send the files to your teacher. You can use these applications Grabador de sonido Linux / [Audacity](#) to record the verbs (check these tutorials [Grabador de sonido Linux](#) and [Audacity](#) on the Virtual Campus of Digital Education).
4. Record yourself reading these sentences and send the files to your teacher: *My father is reading a novel; They are eating pasta; The kids are walking in the park; We are sailing down the river; The woman is taking a picture; The people are swimming in the sea; The man is sunbathing; Are you watching TV?; Paul is writing a novel; Is Mary talking on the phone?*
